Selected candidates participate in an intensive, three-year non-residential, career acceleration process that fosters leadership skills and strengthens research skills. Candidates who complete the three-year process will qualify to become One Planet Laureates.

The call seeks applicants from Algeria, Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Mali, Morocco, Nigeria, Senegal, Tanzania, Togo, and Zambia. Deadline for applications is February 15, 2021.
